# WHAT IS NEW IN THE PROJECT?

From October 2024 to March 2025, the partnership concentrated on finalizing last modifications on the draft version of the digital skills course, which is available here: <https://sdgs4pupils.eu/digital-skills-course-for-teachers/>

Additionally, project coordinator, gave guidelines on how to organize piloting events in Italy, North Macedonia, France (Reunion), Bulgaria and Turkiye.

## BEFORE THE PILOTING

What was expected from partners before the events:

### **Pilot Training for Students**

- 100 students will test the E-learning platform and the SDG-related learning materials.
- The pilot will involve students from Bulgaria, Italy, Turkey, France (Reunion), and North Macedonia.
- An estimated 200 students are expected to use the platform within the first year.

### **Training and Testing with Teachers**

- 25 teachers from 5 schools will participate in digital course training and testing.
- An additional 100 teachers will test the platform functionalities.
- Over 50 teachers are expected to benefit from the digital course in its first year.

### **Training Focus Areas**

- Use of digital tools for collaborative and self-managed learning
- Student engagement strategies for digital classrooms

### **Platform Promotion and Use**

- Information about the platform will be shared with 25 schools per country (~500 schools total).
- The goal is to encourage broader adoption and long-term integration into schools' digital strategies.

# PILOTING OF THE LEARNING MATERIALS

In this period, project partners organized piloting events for testing and presenting the project results.

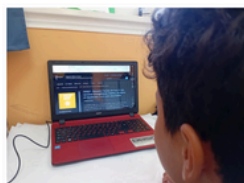
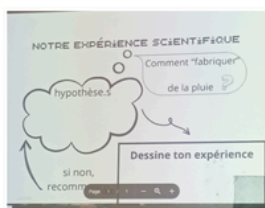
- In Bulgaria, it was tested by teachers and students in Dobri Zhelyazkov vocational school. In total, 20 teachers and 40 students , age 14, from 8th class
- In North Macedonia, the materials were tested and presented in OOU Malina Popivanova, 15 teachers and 26 students were present.
- In Italy, the piloting took place in 2 schools, 14 teachers and 45 students participated.
- In France (Reunion), in total 12 teachers and 27 students participated in the piloting of materials.
- In Turkiye, 20 teachers and 40 students were present at the piloting,
